- **NEW:** Governor Tom Wolf announced today a new program to provide free N95 respirator decontamination to healthcare facilities, first responders, and other eligible organizations that may be experiencing a shortage of the respirators due to limited availability through normal procurement channels. Information about the new service is being distributed to potentially eligible organizations through the PA Emergency Management Agency and PA Department of Health. - **NEW:** Governor Tom Wolf announced today the creation of the Commonwealth Civilian Coronavirus Corps, a public service initiative that will support efforts this fall to increase testing and contact tracing and provide critical new job opportunities in the public health sector. ### **Additional Government Announcements:**

- PA Unemployment: Individuals filing for unemployment benefits have reported long delays in receiving a PIN. The Office of Unemployment Compensation is advising claimants that if they do not receive a PIN within three weeks, they should complete a PIN Reset Request online ([LINK](#)). Once applicants receive their PIN, they can file for all missed weeks dating back to the first missed week of work. - PennDOT announced last week that Pennsylvanians who have an expiring driver license, photo identification card or learner's permit will have more time to renew them. Any of these items scheduled to expire from March 16, 2020 through May 31, 2020, are now extended through June 30, 2020. While PennDOT's Driver License & Photo License Centers remain closed due to the COVID-19, many services can still be completed online. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **UPDATED:** A limited number of state park and forest facilities are scheduled to reopen in the days and weeks ahead. The openings include at least one restroom in day-use areas in state parks, forests and marinas effective May 8; all nine marinas in state parks effective May 8 unless otherwise designated; and all three public golf courses in the system.
