- **NEW:** Responding to pressures from some red counties to comply with state COVID-19 restrictions, Governor Wolf in his daily press conference today reminded Pennsylvanians the importance of staying the course. The governor reiterated that reopening too soon can cause COVID-19 to spread, for cases and deaths to spike and for closures to be reinstated perhaps for much longer. - Governor Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Levine today (5/8) extended the orders for all counties in RED (that includes Delaware and surrounding counties) to June 4th and signed new orders for 24 counties moving them to the YELLOW phase. For additional information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **UPDATED:** Governor Wolf signed an executive order today (4/7) that protects Pennsylvanians from foreclosures or evictions through July 10. The action builds on a Pennsylvania Supreme Court order which closed court eviction proceedings until May 11 and ensures no renter or homeowner will be removed from their home for 60 more days.
