- **UPDATED:** Responding to pressures from some red counties to comply with state COVID-19 restrictions, Governor Wolf in his daily press conference today reminded Pennsylvanians the importance of staying the course. The governor reiterated that reopening too soon can cause COVID-19 to spread, for cases and deaths to spike and for closures to be reinstated perhaps for much longer. - **UPDATED:** Governor Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Levine today (5/8) extended the orders for all counties in RED (that includes Delaware and surrounding counties) to June 4th and signed new orders for 24 counties moving them to the YELLOW phase. **On May 15th, 13 additional counties (for a total of 37) will move to YELLOW. - **NEW Delaware County:** Delaware County Council announced today that additional COVID-19 testing sites, including a mobile unit testing site, are being added in Delaware County. These additional options expand diagnostic testing access for residents whether or not they have health insurance. The mobile unit will be available in communities with the greatest need for testing. - **NEW: Unemployment Appeals Deadline Extended:** Unemployment Compensation applicants who were denied benefits will have more time to appeal the decision if they believe the denial was incorrect. Under normal circumstances, appeals must be filed within 15 calendar days of the mailing date of the determination of eligibility. However, due to delays created by the COVID-19 pandemic, appeals can be filed indefinitely for determinations issued during the pandemic. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
