- Governor Wolf in his daily press conference today (5/11) reminded Pennsylvanians the importance of staying the course. The governor also outlined consequence to counties that do not abide by state law to remain closed. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)

- **UPDATED:** Governor Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Levine today (5/8) extended the orders for all counties in RED (that includes Delaware and surrounding counties) to June 4th. Today, **12** counties (previously 11 as Warren county was added just today) moved to YELLOW. See the map for the 37 total YELLOW counties. 12 more counties will move to the YELLOW phase on Friday, May 22nd. These counties include Adams, Beaver, Carbon, Columbia, Cumberland, Juniata, Mifflin, Perry, Susquehanna, Wyoming, Wayne, and York. For additional information, please see this [LINK](#)

- Governor Wolf announced today that the U.S. Department of Education has approved Pennsylvania's application for \$523.8 million in one-time federal emergency funds to help schools respond to COVID-19 impacts. - **UPDATED: Delaware County:** Delaware County Council announced today that additional COVID-19 testing sites, including a mobile unit testing site, are being added in Delaware County. - **NEW:** PECO is extending its support policies, which include suspending service disconnections, waiving new late fees, and reconnecting customers who were previously disconnected, through at least July 1. - **NEW:** Department of Human Services (DHS) Secretary Miller today announced a Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to help Pennsylvanians during the COVID-19 public health crisis.
