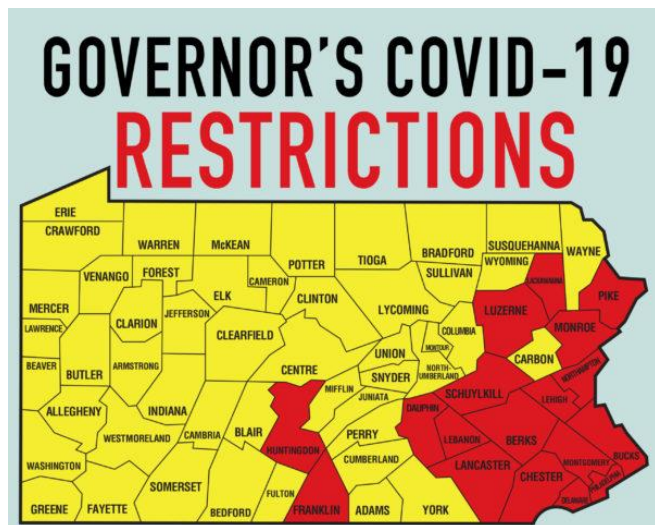

- **NEW:** Governor Wolf and Secretary of Health Dr. Levine announced 12 additional counties will move to **YELLOW** on May 22nd. These counties include Adams, Beaver, Carbon, Columbia, Cumberland, Juniata, Mifflin, Perry, Susquehanna, Wyoming, Wayne, and York. - **NEW:** Pennsylvanians who have an expired Unemployment Compensation claim or have exhausted their benefits under an existing claim can receive an additional 13 weeks of payments through the new Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation program.
