- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced today that additional shipments of testing supplies have been sent to hospitals across Pennsylvania this week. Since March 9, the Pennsylvania Department of Health has distributed supplies to more than 60 hospitals, health care facilities, and county and municipal health departments to help test more than 67,000 patients. - **UPDATED:** Governor Wolf today summarized the current and planned status of counties in his press conference. A summary is provided below. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
  - May 29, 2020:
    - 8 additional counties will move to the YELLOW phase (Dauphin, Franklin, Huntingdon, Lebanon, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike and Schuylkill). **ORDER RELEASED**
    - 17 counties will move to the GREEN phase (Bradford, Cameron, Centre Clarion, Clearfield, Crawford, Elk, Forest, Jefferson, Lawrence, McKean, Montour, Potter, Snyder, Sullivan, Tioga, Venango and Warren).
    - 10 counties will remain in the RED Phase (Berks, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Northampton, Montgomery, and Philadelphia)
  - June 5, 2020:
    - 10 counties will move to the YELLOW Phase (Berks, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Northampton, Montgomery, and Philadelphia).
    - **NEW:** 16 additional counties will move to the GREEN Phase (Allegheny, Armstrong, Bedford, Blair, Butler, Cambria, Clinton, Fayette, Fulton, Greene, Indiana, Lycoming, Mercer, Somerset, Washington, and Westmoreland)
