

- **NEW:** The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission today announced that the cashless, All-Electronic Tolling (AET) system instituted March 16 to minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus will become permanent — a decision that will result in the layoff of approximately 500 employees, primarily toll collectors and fare-collection personnel. - As PA continues to address public health and safety amid the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Wolf today signed today (5/31) a state budget that will provide 12 months of sustained public education funding at 2019-20 levels and makes important investments in communities and programs to help begin to restore the economy. Funding will have an increased impact for PA Education Grants for college students, raising the annual maximum award to \$4,525. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)

 - June 5, 2020 (see map of PA on June 5th below):
 - 10 counties will move to the YELLOW Phase (Berks, Bucks, Chester, **Delaware**, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Northampton, Montgomery, and Philadelphia).
 - **NEW:** 16 additional counties will move to the GREEN Phase (Allegheny, Armstrong, Bedford, Blair, Butler, Cambria, Clinton, Fayette, Fulton, Greene, Indiana, Lycoming, Mercer, Somerset, Washington, and Westmoreland)



- **NEW Delaware County:** In an effort to equip Delaware County’s business community with the necessary supplies to safely reopen, the Bringing Back Delco Task Force is assembling kits of personal protective equipment (PPE). The PPE kits, which can be purchased at a subsidized price at: www.BringingBackDelco.com, include essential safety equipment such as masks, gloves and sanitizer to help our local businesses protect themselves, their employees and the public as they reopen their doors. - **NEW:** As more counties move to the green phase of reopening, the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board recently provided new guidance for businesses with a liquor license in these areas. The guidance includes information on indoor seating, outdoor seating and social distancing, as well as information for breweries, distilleries and wineries. - **UPDATED:** As some voting polling places may be consolidated or relocated due to COVID-19, it is important for all voters to double-check where they should go to vote before, they head out to cast their ballots in the primary election. - The PA Department of Labor and Industry recently uncovered cases of attempted fraud in which scammers tried to use the personal information of victims to file for benefits and route payments into their own bank accounts. In response to these cases, claimants in the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) system will now receive benefits via paper checks delivered through the U.S. Postal Service instead of receiving payments by direct deposit.
