- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced today that the Office of State Fire Commissioner will be working to enact legislation to provide \$50 million in direct financial relief to fire and emergency medical service (EMS) companies negatively impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf today renewed the 90-day disaster declaration he originally signed on March 6 following the announcement of the first two presumptive positive cases of COVID-19 in the commonwealth. The declaration was set to expire on June 4. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced today that the Department of Health reached its testing goals in May with more than 283,000 COVID-19 diagnostic test results reported to the department. Additionally, beginning Friday, June 5, various Walmart and Quest Diagnostics drive-thru testing locations across the state will provide testing for residents living in areas with fewer testing sites. - The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) today (6/3) said elementary and secondary schools in the state's yellow and green phases may resume in person instruction and activities beginning July 1 under a phased reopening approach that first requires schools to develop health and safety plans based on guidelines from the CDC and the state Department of Health. PDE also released guidance that allows [postsecondary institutions and adult basic education programs, effective June 5](#), to begin in-person instruction immediately following the development of a health and safety plan outlining strategies for safe operations.   - June 5, 2020:
    - 10 counties will move to the YELLOW Phase (Berks, Bucks, Chester, **Delaware**, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Northampton, Montgomery, and Philadelphia).
    - **NEW:** 16 additional counties will move to the GREEN Phase (Allegheny, Armstrong, Bedford, Blair, Butler, Cambria, Clinton, Fayette, Fulton, Greene, Indiana, Lycoming, Mercer, Somerset, Washington, and Westmoreland)
