- **NEW:** With the movement of Delaware County and the college to the YELLOW Phase, our Daily Situation Report will now shift to a weekly situation report each Friday afternoon. If the county once again shifts to a RED Phase (hopefully not), Situation Reports will shift back to a daily release.

Significant Federal, State, or County Policy Changes:

PA Recovery Phase: **YELLOW/GREEN** Delaware County Recovery Phase: **YELLOW**

- **NEW:** Effective today, all 67 Pennsylvania counties are either in the yellow or GREEN phase of reopening and Governor Wolf announced that 12 additional counties will move to green at 12:01 a.m., June 12. Those counties include Adams, Beaver, Carbon, Columbia, Cumberland, Juniata, Mifflin, Northumberland, Union, Wayne, Wyoming and York. - **NEW:** After meeting with leaders in Philadelphia and Harrisburg, Governor Wolf announced several actions to improve law enforcement relations with the community and strengthen training and accountability. For more information on the Governor's proposed actions, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** The Pennsylvania Commissions on African American, Latino, Asian Pacific American, Women and LGBTQ Affairs, overseen by Governor Wolf, released a joint statement today honoring the memory of George Floyd and other Americans of color who have lost their lives to police violence, and denouncing indoctrinated racism, bigotry and sanctioned violence. - **NEW:** The PA Departments of Health and Human Services issued guidance for nursing homes, personal care homes, and other long-term and congregate care facilities as counties enter the green phase. To further prevent outbreaks within these vulnerable populations, ongoing restrictions in long-term and congregate care facilities will remain in place at least 28 days after the respective facility's county enters the green phase. - The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) today (6/3) said elementary and secondary schools in the state's yellow and green phases may resume in person instruction and activities beginning July 1 under a phased reopening approach that first requires schools to develop health and safety plans based on guidelines from the CDC and the state Department of Health. PDE also released guidance that allows [postsecondary institutions and adult basic education programs, effective June 5](#), to begin in-person instruction immediately following the development of a health and safety plan outlining strategies for safe operations.
