- **NEW:** The PA Department of Health launched a new internet dashboard to pull Pennsylvania's COVID-19 data and information together to inform Pennsylvanians. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf released today (6/11) updated guidance regarding the types of outdoor recreation that businesses may offer during the yellow and green phases of reopening, and how they may do so safely, as the commonwealth continues to open its own public recreation facilities across the state. - **NEW:** The PA Department of Health issues additional guidance for sports/athletics to operate in COVID-19 response phasing. - **NEW:** The Wolf Administration outlined on June 10th the potential impact of ending the March 6th disaster declaration, while clarifying that the legislature cannot end it unilaterally. This was a reaction to the June 9th vote by the General Assembly to end the disaster declaration with many members claiming their actions ended the business guideline orders. - **NEW:** The Wolf Administration is urging the public to consider how COVID-19 could change or alter emergency preparedness plans leading into summer, when we face the threat of severe weather that comes with warmer weather. The administration recommends that families should review their emergency kits and plans. Emergency kits should be updated with COVID-19 necessities such as cloth masks, hand sanitizer, and medication. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** PA Auditor General DePasquale released this week a special report outlining 18 recommendations to encourage continued bipartisan interest and cooperation in enacting criminal justice reform at the state and county levels. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** The PA Department of Health today issued an order this week requiring that all hospitals take additional steps to further protect their staff and patients from COVID-19. The order requires all hospitals to develop, implement and adhere to additional safety measures by Monday, June 15. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** Governor Wolf this week issued a universal testing order requiring all nursing homes to complete initial baseline COVID-19 testing no later than July 24. - **NEW:** The Wolf Administration announced this week that it has selected Public Health Management Corporation (PHMC) of Philadelphia as its health care emergency preparedness vendor, effective July 8, 2020. PHMC is a nonprofit public health institute that builds healthier communities through partnerships with government, foundations, businesses and community-based organizations. It fulfills its mission to improve the health of the community by providing outreach, health promotion, education, research, planning, technical assistance and direct services. - **NEW:** Governor Tom Wolf this week announced a \$225 million statewide grant program to support small businesses that were impacted by the COVID-19 public health crisis and subsequent business closure order. The funds are available through three programs: \$100 to Main Street Businesses, \$100 Million for the Historically Disadvantaged Business Revitalization Program, and \$25 M for \$25 million for the Loan Payment Deferment and Loss Reserve Program.
