- **NEW:** Governor Wolf signed amended GREEN phase orders today (6/19) for the 8 counties moving to GREEN at 12:01 a.m. tomorrow, June 19. The counties include Dauphin, Franklin, Huntingdon, Luzerne, Monroe, Perry, Pike and Schuylkill. With these orders effective at 12:01 a.m., tomorrow there will be 54 counties in green and 13 counties in yellow. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)

NOTE: While there has not been a confirmation from the Governor office yet, there are some indications that the Philadelphia area counties may move to GREEN on **July 3rd**.



NOTE: Governor Wolf also today (6/19) reminded Pennsylvanians that mask-wearing is required when entering any business in all counties in the state in both yellow and green phases of reopening. - **NEW:** PA Secretary of Health Dr. Levine announced this week a partnership with General Healthcare Resources to assist with the COVID-19 response. General Healthcare Resources will be deploying onsite assessment teams to assist with infection control practices, staffing and PPE training needs. The team will also assist with specimen collection and urgent staffing needs. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** PA Secretary of Health Dr. Levine reminded Pennsylvanians this week to take proper steps to prevent against tick bites and recognize the symptoms of Lyme disease, as some symptoms of Lyme disease are similar to those of COVID-19. Ticks can carry Lyme disease, among other dangerous diseases, that can be severe if not treated properly. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced that people with intellectual disabilities and autism and the providers of support services for these vulnerable Pennsylvanians will receive \$260 million in CARES Act funding to help continue to provide services during the COVID-19 pandemic. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced that beginning Wednesday, June 17, nine more COVID-19 drive-thru testing sites will open in Walmart parking lots across the state, bringing the total to 19 sites at Walmart locations. Quest Diagnostics and Walmart are working with the department to provide no-cost testing in areas where there are fewer testing sites. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced June 17th that the School Safety and Security Committee (SSSC) within the PA Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) has approved the opening of two funding lines totaling \$157.5 million K-12 schools are immediately eligible for to address COVID-19-related health and safety needs for the 2020-2021 school year. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced June 17th the availability of \$40 million in funding through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to support Pennsylvania's dairy industry and food security programs, following months of uncertainty and loss from the COVID-19 pandemic. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced on June 17th more than \$10 million in funding through the federal HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) to support affordable housing projects across the commonwealth. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** On June 17th, the CDC data indicated that PA is one of just three states that has had a downward trajectory of COVID-19 cases for more than 42 days. The other two states are Montana and Hawaii. For more information, please see this [LINK](#)
- **NEW:** The PA Department of Health distributed the fifth shipment of the investigational antiviral medication, remdesivir, to treat patients in the hospital with COVID-19. As of June 18th, 4,788 doses of medication have been sent to 82 hospitals. The federal government distributed the fifth shipment to the department on Wednesday, June 17.
