PA Recovery Phase: **YELLOW / GREEN** Delaware County Recovery Phase: **GREEN**

- **NEW:** Governor Wolf signed amended green phase orders for the 12 counties moving to green at 12:01 a.m. tomorrow, June 26. The counties include Berks, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Erie, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Montgomery, Northampton, Philadelphia, and Susquehanna. With these orders there will be 66 counties in green and one county in yellow in PA. Philadelphia County met the green phase criteria; however, local officials decided to maintain additional restrictions until July 3. For more information, please see this [LINK](#).
- **NEW:** Governor Wolf noted this week that research continues to confirm the importance of wearing masks to stop the spread of COVID-19 and that Pennsylvanians are required to wear masks when entering any business in all counties in both yellow and green phases of reopening. According to a recent [study](#) in the Institute of Physics, wearing simple medical masks or improvised facial coverings reduces community exposures from asymptomatic, but unknowingly infectious, individuals. - **NEW:** PA Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) Secretary Davin announced that the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority (PIDA), Pennsylvania Minority

- **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced this week that since March 1, the population of those in state correctional facilities has been reduced by 3,471 individuals, the largest multiple-month decrease ever experienced by the Department of Corrections and one that likely helped the department reduce the number of COVID-19 cases in facilities. - **NEW:** Governor Wolf announced that 60 senior community centers throughout the commonwealth will be the recipients of PA Department of Aging's 2019-20 Senior Community Center grants – totaling \$2 million in funding appropriated by the General Assembly from the Pennsylvania Lottery. - **NEW:** The PA Department of Health announced that as of earlier this month, the Medical Marijuana Program has exceeded five million dispensing events. The program has also recently operationalized two clinical registrants to participate in the medical marijuana research program, bringing the total number of operational clinical registrants to three. - **NEW: Delaware County:** The Chester/Delaware County Health Department is hosting a free COVID-19 testing site on Saturday, June 27 from 10am-4pm outside of Chester City Hall. Residents 18 years and over are eligible to be tested. The testing is free to the public, however residents who have health insurance are asked to bring their insurance card.
